KIOSK is a structured framework for built environment design management knowledge. This paper explains its structure.

Objectives

There are two KIOSK Objectives, focused on management of the design process:

- to provide readers with useful information on coordination and integration of the various design disciplines in built environment consulting, and
- to develop a network of like-minded people who see the importance of developing strategies for coordination and integration in design for the built environment.

Overview

KIOSK has two main parts:

- a page of links for each management discipline, or recognized sub-discipline; and
- a carefully selected set of useful, relevant articles or white papers for each.

Resources

There are three kinds of resources considered for KIOSK listing:

- **Organizations**, including industry associations, governmental departments and academic institutions
- Companies providing relevant information available to the public, free of charge
- Individuals with particular expertise in a resource area willing to publicly share some aspects of their knowledge

Members

KIOSK will be supported by the following member groups (DRAFT, for discussion):

- Contributing
- Supporting
- Participating
- Advisory Board



Contributing Members are companies or individuals who prepare articles / white papers for inclusion in KIOSK. Acceptance of papers will be based on their relevance to the KIOSK objectives.

Supporting Members are companies or individuals that physically support KIOSK, either through contributing services or paid sponsorship.

Participating Members are registered firms or individuals, and receive the KIOSK newsletter. Participating members have the option of receiving the newsletter free of charge, by providing URL links to KIOSK and to **iProjects** on their websites, or by a cost-of-service subscription of \$1.00/month, paid annually in advance.

Contributing and Supporting members can also be Participating Members.

The KIOSK **Advisory Board** will be drawn by invitation from individuals representing Contributors and Supporting members.

Website

The KIOSK website (not yet operational) will be www.ipkiosk.net. The site will temporarily be a tab in the **iProjects** site (www.iprojects.net.au), but will move to its own site once design and content is sufficiently finalized.

Newsletter

The KIOSK electronic newsletter will initially be published quarterly; and when there is sufficient information to warrant a monthly communication, will go to that schedule.

KIOSK and the KIOSK newsletter will be supported by advertising revenue from Contributing Members. We are working on an appropriate model.
